Subject: Bus stops on North-South Road at East Kapolei Station

Hi Ken,

I'm working on rail station access for the transit project. We are now working on the issue of bus access to East Kapolei station, which is the western terminal station of the initial 20-mile rail line. Most of the people predicted to use this station will arrive by bus from other parts of Ewa and Kapolei.

We would prefer to have on-street bus stops on North-South Road directly in front of each of the two rail station entrances. That would provide the quickest transfer between bus and train. The two station entrances are currently planned for the northeast and northwest corners of the intersection of North-South and East-West Roads. That would require a far-side bus stop in the northbound direction on N-S Road and a near-side bus stop in the southbound direction.

We understand that a near-side bus stop may not be desirable from a traffic perspective. Could we meet and discuss this issue? Hopefully we can come up with a solution that works for everyone.
