Hi Ted -

Good recap; but I have a couple of matters that need to be addressed.

Regarding the Kakaako Park impact that we discussed, it is my understanding that FTA will require the Section 4(f) analysis to be included in the FEIS; no Supplemental DEIS will be required. Please confirm this.

The second item is the provision of printed copies upon request at no charge. Contrary to what was discussed, the Gold Line EIS stated in its Abstract that copies of the DEIS/DEIR were available for purchase in hard copy form and on a CD-ROM; therefore, the Gold Line even charged for CD copies. Why is FTA imposing a requirement on Honolulu to provide free printed copies? Will FTA assume the additional printing costs?

Will get you the remaining sections of the DEIS for your review before I leave today.

Just to recap:

Chapter 1,2,3,6 (confirmed) and 8 are good for publication.

We owe comments on Chapter 7 (which you will resend shortly) and the Executive Summary.

You will send to FTA revised Chapters 4 and 5, and your suggestions for the abstract language. However, on the abstract we have advised you that we will not accept significant changes to that language as we had a specific purpose in mind for that language.

On the DEIS availability, we have directed DTS to advertise the availability of the document without mention of availability of hard copies. If requested, DTS will provide hardcopies at no cost.

We spoke to Renee on the legal review. She agreed that a formal signoff by your legal counsel is not required at this time. However, she strongly advises that your legal representation be more closely involved in the preparation and review of the document and be aware of changes and alterations. You should also have legal representation in place that is knowledgeable on the document contents and prepared to defend the document.
