




City Center AIS Field Work Traffic Update | Week of Sept. 23, 2012

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) wants to inform drivers that archaeological survey work continues next week in the urban Honolulu area for the rail transit project.

Motorists are advised of lane closures related to the survey work being conducted in the Kaka'ako area. Work will require lane closures during non-peak traffic hours.

For the safety of both the work crews and motorists, the public is advised to proceed with caution through these areas. Drivers should anticipate possible traffic delays or use alternate routes during work hours, and provide a safe distance between themselves and the construction workers and equipment.

Work for the week of Sunday, September 23, through Saturday, September 29, will take place at the following locations between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m., unless otherwise noted:

- Halekauwila Street between Cooke Street and Ahui Street
- Nimitz Highway between Fort Street and Alakea Street (between 6 p.m. to 7 a.m.)
- Dillingham Boulevard between Alakawa Street and Akepo Lane

The City is conducting the archaeological survey work along the urban Honolulu section of the Honolulu rail transit route to identify potential archaeological, historical and cultural resources. The archaeological work will aid rail project staff in their design of the elevated rail guideway.

Contractors Cultural Surveys Hawaii Inc. and Royal Contracting Co. are conducting the fieldwork.

The survey work will be completed before rail construction begins in the urban Honolulu area, as specified under the rail project's programmatic agreement relating to cultural and historic resources.

NOTICE TO MOTORISTS

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation continues with the Archaeological Inventory Survey in the Airport and City Center sections of the Honolulu Rail Transit Project. Work continues to commence between September 17 - 29, 2012 and will require mobile lane closures during non-peak traffic hours. Work will be performed in the following areas between the hours of 8:30am and 3:30pm, unless otherwise noted below:

- Halekauwila St. between Cooke St. and Ahui St.
- Dillingham Blvd. between Walakamilo Rd. and Kohou St. (or 7:30pm - 3:30am)
- Kamehameha Highway between Makalapa Rd./Radford Dr. and Center Dr./Plantation Dr.
- Dillingham Blvd. between Alakawa St. and Akepo Ln.
- Dillingham Blvd. between Kalihi St. and McNeil St.
- Waimanu St. between Kamakee St. and Pensacola St.
- Pensacola St. between Kona St. and Waimanu St.
- Kamehameha Hwy. between Middle St. and Puuhale Rd.
- Dillingham Blvd. between Alakawa St. and Kaaahl St.
- Lagoon Dr. between Waiwai Lp. and Aolele St.
- Nimitz Hwy. between Aloha Tower Dr. and Bishop St. (or 7:30pm - 3:30am)
- Halekauwila St. between Punchbowl St. and South St. (or 7:30pm - 3:30am)
- Waimanu St. between Kamakee St. and Pensacola St.
- Kona St. between Piikoi St. and Kona Iki St. (or 7:30pm - 3:30am)

The public will be notified of detours and change of access via traffic control signs. Special duty police officers will be used when needed to direct traffic at affected areas. Motorists are advised to anticipate possible traffic delays or use alternate routes.
