




City Center AIS Field Work Traffic Update | Week of Nov. 18, 2012

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) wants to inform drivers that archaeological survey work continues next week in the urban Honolulu area for the rail transit project.

Motorists are advised of lane closures related to the survey work being conducted. Work will require lane closures during non-peak traffic hours.

For the safety of both the work crews and motorists, the public is advised to proceed with caution through these areas. Drivers should anticipate possible traffic delays or use alternate routes during work hours, and provide a safe distance between themselves and the construction workers and equipment.

Work for the week of Sunday, November 18, through Saturday, November 24, will take place at the following locations between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.:

- Kamehameha Highway between Middle Street and Laumaka Street
- Halekauwila Street between Keawe Street and Cooke Street

The City is conducting the archaeological survey work along the urban Honolulu section of the Honolulu rail transit route to identify potential archaeological, historical and cultural resources. The archaeological work will aid rail project staff in their design of the elevated rail guideway.

Contractors Cultural Surveys Hawaii Inc. and Royal Contracting Co. are conducting the fieldwork.

The survey work will be completed before rail construction begins in the urban Honolulu area, as specified under the rail project's programmatic agreement relating to cultural and historic resources.

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation continues with an Archaeological Inventory Survey in the City Center section of the Honolulu Rail Transit Project. Work continues between November 18, 2012 through November 24, 2012 and will require mobile lane closures during non-peak traffic hours. Work will be performed in the following areas between the hours of 8:30am and 3:30pm:

- Kamehameha Highway between Middle Street and Laumaka Street
- Halekauwila Street between Keawe Street and Cooke Street

The public will be notified of detours and change of access via traffic control signs. Special duty police officers will be used when needed to direct traffic at affected areas. Motorists are advised to anticipate possible traffic delays or use alternate routes.
