## *FARRINGTON HIGHWAY TO CLOSE MONDAY NIGHT*

Beginning Monday night, November 25, HART will close Farrington Highway in both directions between Kualakai Parkway and Old Fort Weaver Road so that work crews can safely relocate major utility lines along a narrow two-lane stretch of the highway just west of Kahi Mohala.

That section of Farrington is scheduled to remain closed through April 2014.

Between now and Monday night, westbound Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway and Old Fort Weaver remains closed but is open to eastbound commuters.

## *RAIL TRANSIT TO BENEFIT AIRPORT WORKERS AND TRAVELERS*

The holiday travel season will soon be upon us---the time of year when people travel to spend time with family and friends.

The Honolulu International Airport serves as Hawaii's hub for holiday travel. Soon, travelers from the mainland coming home for the holidays, local residents flying to the neighbor islands, and visitors wanting to escape the cold winter weather and vacation in Hawaii for the holidays, will all be able to take advantage of the Honolulu International Airport rail station.

The Honolulu International Airport station on Aolele Street will feature pedestrian walkways to airport terminals and travelers will be able to bring their luggage on board. A ride to or from the Downtown Station will take only 12 minutes, or 16 minutes to the Ala Moana Center Station and 8 minutes to the Pearlridge Station.

And the Honolulu International Airport Station is not only for travelers. About 15,000 people work at the airport every day, and they, too, can get to and from work quickly and easily via rail.

Rail serving the Honolulu International Airport will provide convenient and reliable transportation service with no traffic congestion or parking worries not only for holiday travelers, but also for local residents, employees and visitors throughout the year.

## *TRAFFIC ALERT*



Nighttime lane closures will take place in Aiea along Honomanu Street in both directions near Kamehameha Highway from Sunday, November 24 to Thursday,

November 28 between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Drivers will not be able to access Honomanu Street from Kamehameha Highway during the work but should use Moanalua Road instead.

Traffic signals will be turned off temporarily along Farrington Highway in Waipahu at Leoku and Leokane Streets on Tuesday, November 26. A special-duty police officer will direct traffic in the area.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway between Leokane Street and Leoku Street will be closed from Monday, November 25 to Thursday, November 28 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Lane closures in Waipahu will also take place eastbound and westbound from Monday, November 25 to Wednesday, November 27 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. along:

- Farrington Highway near Kahualii Street and Waipahu Depot Road

Lane closures eastbound and westbound in Waipahu will also take place from Sunday, November, 24 to Thursday, November 28 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. along:

- Farrington Highway between Old Fort Weaver Road and Kahualii Street

One lane in each direction of Farrington Highway in Waipahu will remain open at all times.

The westbound lanes of Farrington Highway near Kahualii Street will be closed from Sunday November 24 to Tuesday, November 26 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Motorists will be contraflowed through the area.

In Kapolei, the right southbound lane of Kalaeloa Boulevard near Opakapaka Street will be closed between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. from Monday, November 25 to Wednesday, November 27.

The inside lanes of Kamehameha Highway in both directions between Kuleana Road and the HECO Waiau power plant is closed until mid-December. Left turns from Kamehameha Highway into the HECO plant will be restricted. Two westbound and eastbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway will remain open in that area.

Some lanes of Kamehameha Highway will be closed in both directions from Monday, November 25 to Wednesday, November 27 between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. between Center Drive and Halawa Drive.

Also in the airport area, lane closures will take place from Monday, November 25 to Wednesday, November 27 between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. along Aolele Street near the H-1 Freeway off-ramp and at Paiea Street. And the right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway near Middle Street will be closed from Monday, November 25 to Wednesday, November 27 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Lane closures on the H-1/Moanalua Freeway on-ramp along Kamehameha Highway

near Aloha Stadium will take place from Monday, November 25 to Friday, November 29 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. and from the evening of Tuesday, November 26 through Wednesday, November 27.

Lane closures in Kalihi will take place from Monday, November 25 to Wednesday, November 27 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. eastbound and westbound on:


- Dillingham Boulevard between Kohou Street and Waiakamilo Road
- Dillingham Boulevard between Kalihi Street and Kaaahi Street
- Kaaahi Street between Dillingham Boulevard and Kaaahi Place

Motorists should anticipate some possible delays in traffic and proceed with caution through the work areas.
