## *HART CANCELS WORK IN ADVANCE OF STORM SYSTEMS*

Working with city and state agencies to ensure Oahu's roads are kept clear for emergency and public safety purposes, HART has canceled all rail construction beginning tonight and continuing through at least this weekend.

In anticipation of two storm systems on Oahu, construction crews will be working today to secure construction equipment. For the safety of both the work crews and motorists, drivers are cautioned to provide a safe distance between their vehicles and the workers and their equipment.

The rail construction along Farrington Highway in Ewa and Waipahu, Kamehameha Highway in Pearl City and Aiea and various city streets in Kalihi, downtown Honolulu and Kakaako is scheduled to resume next week.


airport, more than 15,000 passengers are expected to eventually use the station every day.

### *WEEKLY TRAFFIC ALERT*



**All lane closures scheduled for next week are subject to change and may be postponed due to inclement weather. HART will provide updates as situations warrant.**

### **EWA**

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road will be closed Monday through Friday through the end of August between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. Motorists should instead use either the H-1 Freeway or Kapolei Parkway.

Left turns from Farrington Highway onto Fort Weaver Road northbound will be restricted 24/7 through the end of August. Eastbound drivers using Farrington Highway will need to take a detour up Leoku Street and use either Leolua Street or Waipahu Street to access Fort Weaver Road.

### **H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE**

Two southbound lanes of the H-2 Freeway near the H-1/H-2 merge will be closed Sunday, August 10 to Thursday, August 14 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

### **WAIPAHU**

An eastbound lane of Farrington Highway between Leokane Street and Pupukahi Street, as well as Leonui Street, will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Eastbound lanes of Farrington Highway between Waipahu Depot Street and Mokuola Street will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The westbound lanes of Farrington Highway between Paiwa Street and Kahualii Street will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Westbound left-turn lane pockets at the Paiwa Street and Waipio Point Access Road intersections will be shortened during the construction.

### **PEARL CITY**

Two westbound lanes and two eastbound lanes along Kamehameha Highway between Waiawa Road and Kuleana Road will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. The Acacia Road intersection will be closed after 9 p.m.

The outside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Acacia Road and Waimano Home Road will be closed weekdays 24/7, and an additional eastbound lane will be closed weekdays between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The inner eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway near Kuleana Road will be closed 24/7, and one eastbound lane will be closed weekdays between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

### **AIEA**

Two eastbound and westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Hekaha Street and between Pali Momi Street and Honomanu Street will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday August 15 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Eastbound traffic will be directed to a temporary lane during the work hours.

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street will be closed 24/7.

**The right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Salt Lake Boulevard will be closed 24/7 until further notice.** One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in the same vicinity will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. and between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

### **KALIHI**

Inside lanes of Dillingham Boulevard will be closed in both directions between Middle Street and Laumaka Street from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

### **DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO**

Westbound lanes of Halekauwila Street between South Street and Mililani Street will be closed from Monday, August 11 to Friday, August 15 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m., and eastbound lanes of Halekauwila between South Street and Keawe Street between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m.
