FIRST RAIL TRACKS INSTALLED



Workers have begun installing some of the steel train rails on the rail guideway segments near what will be HART's Hoopili rail station in Ewa.

All told, HART will use about 140 miles of track for the Honolulu rail project. Tracks will run in each direction. A "third" rail will power the system.

HART will also build tracks at its Rail Operations Center in Waipahu where the train cars will be cleaned, maintained and stored.

HART purchased more than 13,000 tons of steel rail and other track-related materials, including concrete ties, fasteners and special trackwork for the Honolulu rail transit system. The total cost for all the products was \$77.4 million.

HART anticipates delivery of its rail cars, which are now in the initial stages of manufacturing in Italy, in mid-2016.

WAIPAHU BUSINESS & COMMUNITY MEETING

During construction, HART and its rail guideway contractor Kiewit are holding monthly meetings for business owners and operators as well as members of the community along the rail alignment.

The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, December 10 at 6:30 p.m. at the Waipahu High School Library, located at 94-1211 Farrington Highway.

EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road will remain closed in both directions until the end of January.

One westbound lane of Keahumoa Street off Kualakai Parkway will remain closed 24/7.

H-1 FREEWAY WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Two southbound lanes of the H-2 Freeway near the H-1/H-2 merge will be closed Sunday through Thursday between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

H-1 FREEWAY WAIPAHU OFF RAMP

The Waipahu off ramp from the H-1 Freeway westbound (Exit 8B) will be closed Sunday through Thursday from 9 p.m. to 4 a.m.

WAIPAHU

One eastbound left-turn lane from Farrington Highway onto Leoku Street and the eastbound left turn onto Leokane Street will be closed 24/7 until the end of the year.

The outside lanes of Farrington Highway west of the Kunia Road overpass will be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m., as will the eastbound lanes between Leoku Street and Leokane Street and the outside lanes between Leokane Street and Pupukahi Street.

The northbound lanes of Pupukahi Street and Leoku Street will also be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

There will be staggered lane closures on Farrington Highway eastbound and westbound between Waikele Road and Aniani Place weeknights from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Traffic will be contraflowed Monday through Friday along Farrington Highway from Mokuola Street to Kahualii Street. Two eastbound lanes of Farrington Highway will be open between 5 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and two westbound lanes between 3:30 p.m. and 7 p.m.

Left turns will be restricted at Moloalo Street and at the Paiwa Street intersection.

PEARL CITY

Various sections of Kamehameha Highway along the outside lanes in both directions in Pearl City and Aiea will be closed weekdays between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Two westbound lanes along Kamehameha Highway from Waiawa Road to Waimano Home Road will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. The Waimano Home Road intersection will be closed weeknights after 9 p.m. The eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway from Waihona Street to the merge at Farrington Highway and the westbound lanes at Waiawa Road will be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway from Puu Poni Street to Kaonohi Street will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes will be closed between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. One eastbound lane near the HECO-Waiiau power plant and fronting Neal Blaisdell Park will be closed 24/7. Left turns at Kuleana Street will also be restricted.

AIEA

Two lanes of Kamehameha Highway eastbound and westbound from Pali Momi Street to Honomanu Street will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Eastbound drivers will be contraflowed to the westbound side of the highway during those hours.

One eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway from Lipoa Place to Pali Momi Street near the Pearl Kai Shopping Center and one near McGrew Point will be closed 24/7.

Westbound drivers along Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium will be contraflowed to the eastbound side of the highway weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.
