BACK TO WORK



With the holiday season behind us, construction crews have resumed work on the Honolulu rail transit project.

For the first time, HART and its contractor, Kiewit, will close one of the westbound lanes of the H-1 Freeway near the H-1/H-2 merge to continue nighttime construction of the rail guideway over the freeway. That lane and two eastbound lanes will be closed from 8 p.m. until 4 a.m. beginning Monday night and running through early Friday morning of next week.

Workers will continue construction of guideway columns and spans in Ewa and Waipahu. And there's utility relocation and shaft drilling work along Kamehameha Highway in Pearl City and Aiea. Workers are also busy doing work on the yard and the buildings at the Rail Operations Center between Leeward Community College and Waipahu High School, and have begun survey and utility relocation work in the Airport area.

For the safety of workers and commuters alike, HART reminds motorists to drive carefully

through construction zones.

WEEKLY TRAFFIC ALERT

H-1 FREEWAY WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Two eastbound lanes and one westbound lane of the H-1 Freeway near the H-1/H-2 merge will be closed Monday night through Friday morning between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m.

The westbound H-1 Waipahu off-ramp will also be closed overnight Monday through Thursday nights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road will remain closed in both directions until the end of January.

WAIPAHU (FARRINGTON HIGHWAY)

One eastbound lane of Farrington Highway will be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. from Waikele Road to Aniani Place and from Waipahu Depot Street to Mokuola Street, as will the inside lanes from Leoku Street to Leokane Street and from Pupukahi Street to Waikele Road. In addition, one eastbound lane from Mokuola Street to Paiwa Street and from Waipahu Depot Street to Mokuola Street as well as the inside lanes from Leoku Street to Leokane Street and from Pupukahi Street to Waikele Road will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Traffic will be contraflowed Monday through Friday along Farrington Highway from Mokuola Street to Kahualii Street. Two eastbound lanes of Farrington Highway will be open between 5 a.m. and 8:30 a.m. and two westbound lanes between 3:30 p.m. and 7 p.m.

Left turns will be restricted at Moloalo Street and at the Paiwa Street intersections.

PEARL CITY (KAMEHAMEHA HIGHWAY)

Two westbound lanes along Kamehameha Highway from Waiawa Road to Waimano Home Road will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. The westbound lanes near the entrance to Leeward Community College will be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. and traffic will be contraflowed.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway from Puu Poni Street to Kaonohi Street will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes will be closed between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. One eastbound lane near the HECO-Waiiau power plant and one eastbound lane fronting Neal Blaisdell Park will be closed 24/7.

Alternate lane closures along Kaluamoi Place will take place weekdays between 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. One lane will remain open at all times.

The intersections of Kamehameha Highway and Kaahumanu Street and Kanuku Street will

be closed after 10 p.m.

AIEA

One eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway from Lipoa Place to Pali Momi Street near the Pearl Kai Shopping Center and one near McGrew Point will be closed 24/7. Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway in the same vicinity will be closed between 8 p.m. Friday, January 9 and 9 a.m. Saturday, January 10 for utility work.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. from Pali Momi Street to Lipoa Place. Two eastbound lanes in the same area will be closed between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

The eastbound Moanalua Freeway on-ramp near McGrew Point will be closed weeknights between 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Westbound drivers along Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium and near Honomanu Street will be contraflowed to the eastbound side of the highway weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

PEARL HARBOR/AIRPORT AREA

One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway from Center Drive to Radford Drive will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

One eastbound lane of Nimitz Highway from Valkenburgh Street to Main Street will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

One eastbound and one westbound lane of Nimitz Highway at the intersection of Puuloa Road will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.
