PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION HAS RECORD-SETTING YEAR



San Francisco's BART system was one of several grade-separated rail systems to increase ridership in 2014

For public transportation in the United States, 2014 was a record-setting year. Americans took 10.8 billion trips on their buses, trains and trolleys---the highest public transportation ridership in 58 years.


The American Public Transportation Association (APTA) annually publishes ridership data collected from transit agencies all across the country.

The figures show an increase nationally of 3.3 percent for ridership on grade-separated rail systems, which include both elevated rail and subways.

Some of the cities with grade-separated systems that showed increased ridership over 2013 were Miami, New York, San Francisco and Atlanta. Boston and Chicago also reported increased ridership on their rail systems.

WEEKLY TRAFFIC ALERT

Friday, March 13 to Friday, March 20



Beginning Monday evening, March 16, 24/7 lane closures will take place along Kamehameha Highway between Acacia Road and Waimano Home Road. One eastbound left-turn lane from Kamehameha onto Waimano Home Road and the inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway will be closed 24 hours a day. One westbound left-turn lane from Kamehameha onto Lehua Avenue and the inside westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway will also be closed 24 hours a day.

KAPOLEI/EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road will be closed in both directions tonight and for the next couple of weekends. The section of highway will close at 7:30

p.m. on Fridays and reopen at 5 a.m. on Mondays. During the week, eastbound Farrington will be open from 5 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. while westbound Farrington will be closed 24/7.

H-1 FREEWAY WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Up to two westbound lanes and three eastbound lanes of the H-1 Freeway near the H-1/H-2 merge will be closed Sunday night through Friday morning between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. Westbound lane closures begin at 9 p.m. each evening.

WAIPAHU (FARRINGTON HIGHWAY)

The outside lanes of Farrington Highway between Leoku Street and Leokane Street will be closed weeknights from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. while the inside lanes will be closed from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Starting Monday, March 16, one of the two eastbound left-turn lanes from Farrington Highway onto Leoku Street will be closed 24/7. Left turns from Farrington onto Leole Street will be restricted.

The outside lanes of Farrington Highway will be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. from Waipahu Depot Street to Mokuola Street.

The intersection at Farrington Highway and Moloalo Street will be closed 24/7.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway from Kahualii Street to the Kamehameha Highway overpass will be closed weeknights between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The right lane of the eastbound on-ramp to the H-1 Freeway from Farrington Highway will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. The on-ramp will remain open.

PEARL CITY (KAMEHAMEHA HIGHWAY)

One eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway and one of the two eastbound left-turn lanes from Kamehameha onto Acacia Road fronting Pearl Highland Center will be closed 24/7. Eastbound U-turns will be permitted at the intersection. One westbound left-turn lane and the inside westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway will also be closed 24/7.

One westbound lane along Kamehameha Highway near Acacia Road will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and one eastbound lane between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. The intersections at both Acacia Road and Waimano Home Road will be closed after 9 p.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway from Kuleana Road to Kaonohi Street will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes will be closed between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Alternate lane closures along Kaluamoi Place will take place weekdays between 7:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. One lane will remain open at all times.

AIEA

One eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway from Lipoa Place to Pali Momi Street near the Pearl Kai Shopping Center and one near McGrew Point will be closed 24/7.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. while two eastbound lanes will be closed between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway from Pali Momi Street to Honomanu Street will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes will be closed between 7 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. The intersection at Honomanu Street will be closed after 9 p.m.

One lane of the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp will be closed weeknights from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium will be closed weeknights between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. and two eastbound lanes will be closed from 7 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

PEARL HARBOR/AIRPORT AREA

Two eastbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway from Makalapa Drive to Arizona Street and one near the Makalapa Road/Radford Drive intersection will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

The right-turn lane from Kamehameha Highway onto Radford Drive will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Right turns will be permitted at the intersection.

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway from Makalapa Road to Center Drive will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. The left-turn lane into Makalapa Gate will be contraflowed.

The right-turn lane from Center Drive onto Kamehameha Highway will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

The bus stop at Kamehameha Highway westbound and Center Drive will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

The outside westbound lane of Mauka Frontage Road/Kamehameha Highway near Center Drive will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Makalapa Road and Center Drive will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. The left-turn lane will be contraflowed.

The right lane of the H-1 Freeway westbound Exit 15A will be closed weekdays between 8:30 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.
