

CONSTRUCTION PROGRESSES INTO WAIPAHU



Nearly 160 columns now stretch from the eastern edge of the town of Kapolei and into Waipahu east of Fort Weaver Road as construction work progresses.

This summer, the rail guideway which is now nearly three miles long, will be built over the Fort Weaver Road/Kunia Road overpass.



Balanced cantilever construction over the H-1 Freeway is also well underway.

Between the support columns several concrete segments have been erected, which will eventually form a bridge for the rail to travel from the Leeward Community College station in Waipahu to the Pearl Highlands station in Pearl City.

As construction work continues, HART urges motorists to drive safely through its construction zones.

DOWNTOWN TOD PLAN MOVING AHEAD



The Downtown Neighborhood Transit-Oriented Development Plan is being finalized for review by the Honolulu City Council.

The plan for public improvements around the Iwilei, Chinatown and Downtown rail stations includes recommendations for enhancements and preservation in Chinatown, an urban mixed-use district in Iwilei with a range of housing choices and expanded hours of activity in Downtown Honolulu.

The Department of Planning and Permitting has scheduled a community meeting to discuss the Downtown Neighborhood TOD Plan for Tuesday, May 12 at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be held at the Kaiulani Elementary School Library at 783 North King Street.
