## H-1 FREEWAY OFF-RAMP TO JOINT BASE PEARL HARBOR-HICKAM AND NIMITZ HIGHWAY EASTBOUND ONGOING THROUGH DECEMBER 2020

### OVERNIGHT: 8 PM TO 5 AM



### TRAFFIC PLANS

- The off-ramp from the H-1 Freeway eastbound to Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam will continue to be closed intermittently overnight between 8 PM and 5 AM through December 2020 to support overhead guideway construction work at the Pearl Harbor Interchange.
- For the public’s safety during this closure, all vehicles wanting to exit from the H-1 Freeway eastbound to Nimitz Highway and Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam will be detoured to the Airport Exit (Exit 16).
- Motorists wanting to access Nimitz, O’Malley and Kuntz gates will be rerouted onto Nimitz Highway westbound via Aolele Street and Paiea Street.

## NIGHT WORK

The Department of Health has approved a variance for Community Noise Control for night work activities related to the Airport Guideway and Stations segment of the Honolulu Rail Transit Project.

Standard construction equipment, such as bulldozers, excavators, soil augers, backhoes, graders, pavers, mixers, trucks, cranes, saws, generators, compressors and pumps, shall be allowed 24 hours a day during project construction.

Light impact equipment, such as jackhammers, pavement saws and pavement breakers, will be limited to specific night hours in accordance with DOH's approved variance.
