Subject: Comment Matrices and Responses on the Honolulu FEIS

Greetings, all –

The City sent to us late yesterday afternoon comment/response matrices for the comments received on the Honolulu FEIS. The matrices and the comments themselves are saved on the S drive under: **S:\Honolulu\Comments on FEIS**. In the folder there are several tables related to comments we received on the Final EIS. Two tables contain the comments we received from agencies and the public. The comments break down as follows:

Agencies: 9 letters (34 comments)
Public: 43 letters/emails (289 comments)

For the administrative record only, the City has provided short responses for each individual comment in the third column of each table. The last column is indicated by a “Yes/No” response. The City provided a separate table for comments receiving a “Yes” designation. Comments with a “Yes” designation also have been briefly summarized in the ROD. I am imagining that the table responding to all comments would be attached to the ROD, but they ROD text would only address new issues.

Also included in the folder is a table that lists the comments received by category (agency/organization/business/public).

The draft ROD is being reviewed by Corps Counsel (Jesse Souki) this week and the City expects to send it to FTA by mid-week for your review.

The City would like to have a call to review the comments on Thursday. I feel like it would be most efficient for FTA to review the comments internally and have an internal discussion, at least between Ted and/or me and Chris or Renee, before having a teleconference with the City. Ted and/or me can take an initial look at the comments and flag responses that we need assistance with (as a heads up it will likely be 4(f) comments).
