Mr. Apo:

Thanks very much for the opportunity to review your draft list of questions in advance of tomorrow's meeting. It will help make tomorrow's discussions more efficient and useful to you.

Our initial review of the questions suggests that many deal with detailed technical issues. FTA's customary practice is to deal with these important issues at a staff level to ensure that we have the appropriate staff experts at the table and have sufficient time for discussion. We are therefore reserving time after the meeting with the administrator to get into the details at whatever length that you and your colleagues find useful.

You might want to highlight the broader policy questions that you want the administrator to address during the initial meeting with him.

We look forward to any update to the questions that you might be able to send us later today.

FTA staff attending the meeting with the administrator will include Susan Borinsky and me. Susan is our Associate Administrator for Planning and Environment. I'm FTA's team leader for the Honolulu project.

FTA staff participating in the follow-up meeting will again include Susan and me, as well as other staff from both FTA headquarters and our Region IX office in San Francisco. We are still assembling a list of participants because we set this meeting and invited participants only this morning.
