While FTA is awaiting the revised plan, the current financial assessment is appropriate for the current stage of the project.

Hi Matt and Susan

Paul has gotten a request from a reporter to speak with Peter about the Honolulu project. Since Peter is out of town, how would you like to handle the request? I know Peter wants to maintain a consistent FTA message with the Honolulu press and has decided to handle many of the inquiries himself. One approach would be that we send the reporter written answers to his questions. Below I have proposed some responses based on the meeting I went to yesterday with Peter, Kate and Representative Abercrombie. Please let Paul and I know if you agree with proceeding in this fashion, whether you have edits to the text suggested below, or whether you think we should inform Peter of the reporter's questions.

1. What concerns does the FTA have about the funding plan that Honolulu City officials have outlined for the City's elevated-rail project?
2. Did anyone from the FTA tell Hawaii Governor Linda Lingle that the financial outline for the Honolulu rail proposal would have to be reworked before any possibility of moving forward?

Answer

The FTA process has a series of project development phases (preliminary engineering, final design, and construction grant agreement). At each phase, the requirements that project sponsors must meet become more stringent in terms of the level of engineering and design, the confidence in the cost estimate, and the strength of the financial plan. In terms of committed funds, the Honolulu project is ahead of most projects in preliminary engineering because of the excise tax currently being collected. As part of our standard process, in our letters granting approval of a project into one phase, we typically identify areas that must be addressed

before the project will be allowed into the next phase. Thus, in our letter dated October 16, 2009 granting the Honolulu project entry into preliminary engineering, we included the following paragraph. This is also the information we share with Governor Lingle.

Further, the City should be aware that FTA's standards for the financial rating are higher for entry into final design than for entry into preliminary engineering (PE). The higher standard for final design includes an assessment of the robustness of the financial plan against increases in costs, shortfalls in revenue streams, and competing demands on funding sources. Some elements of the current financial plan may not fare well in the stress tests that FTA will apply to evaluate robustness. These elements include the projected revenue stream from the General Excise Tax, the diversion of FTA Section 5307 funds from ongoing capital needs of the bus system, and the increasing share of the City's annual budget that is required to fund the transit system. Were this plan submitted today in support of a request to advance the project into final design, its weaknesses would likely cause FTA to deny the request. Therefore, continued development and strengthening of the financial plan will be a crucial part of the PE effort.
