

# Meeting Minutes

**Meeting:** State Controller – Aloha Stadium

**Date:** May 15, 2009

**Purpose:** Review potential alignment within Aloha Stadium Property

**Minutes:**

- **Background:** This meeting is a follow-up to a May 1 meeting regarding the alignment and station location at Aloha Stadium. At this meeting Mr. Sato asked the RTD to look at different options with the following criteria:
  - Consider in the RTD plans the relocation of Ewa-bound Salt Lake to run parallel to Diamond Head-bound Salt Lake around the Kamehameha lot, so not limit future roadway options
  - Widening of Kamehameha Hwy to accommodate the realigned Salt Lake Blvd.
  - Include 3-track/2platform option
  - Move the station to the median of Kamehameha.
  
- Three options were:
  - Option 1: The alignment is similar to the original shown at the May 1<sup>st</sup> meeting, but the alignment/station was moved mauka to allow for Salt Lake realignment.
  
  - Option 2: Station moved to the median, with touch downs on both sides of Kamehameha Hwy.
  
  - Option 3: 3-track/2 platform option in Kamehameha lot, with one train length passing track with access to platform.
  
- Comparative matrix (attached) was distributed and each option was discussed.
- **Conclusions:**
  - Option 1 provides the greatest capacity for events
  - Option 1 has significantly less impacts to utilities and the stat highway
  - Option 1 meets the Aloha Stadium goals to allow for future changes to Salt Lake Blvd.

- Option is less costly.
- **Direction:** Mr. Sato agreed the RTD will continue its planning and engineering using Option 1
- Other matters: DAGS has 2 action items remaining from the May 1 meeting:
  - Provide RTD copy of Department of the Interior's letter regarding transfer of lands to release Aloha Stadium property for development
  - Map of "recreational land" at Stadium.
