If FAA is a cooperating agency that means that FAA doesn't have to do a separate environmental review, which would save time. But that in itself does not resolve FTA's concerns about the alignment and mitigations for the project on/near the airport, does it? Wouldn't we still want a stronger statement (not just an agreement to do further study) from FAA/HDOT about what will constitute the project in that area? If I understood Chris's points today, additional FTA NEPA work is required whether Honolulu chooses option 1) a better definition of the project and mitigations on the airport property, or option 2) another alignment.
