Dr. Jackson-Retondo,

In follow-up to the phone message that I left you, I am working on behalf of the City and County of Honolulu on the EIS and Section 106 coordination for their high-capacity transit corridor project, which will construct an approximately 20-mile elevated transit line on the Island of Oahu. The FTA has delegated Section 106 consultation authority to the City and County of Honolulu for this project. We have been in consultation with the SHPD, and Dr. Liverman requested that I consult you prior to our next coordination meeting regarding evaluation of effects to the Pearl Harbor National Historic Landmark.

I have attached 2 files: 1) a copy of the scoping letter that we received from NPS on the project, and 2) maps of the maximum potential areas of encroachment (vacant space and parking lots) that the project would have into the PHNHL. I hope that these will be useful to you in understanding the nature and extent of project effects. I will again attempt to contact you by phone to describe the project. If it would be helpful, I will be in San Francisco on other project work twice in the next month, and could come to your office either May 28 or 29, or the morning of June 12. If June 12, City environmental planning staff would join me.
