Hi Liz –

In response to your request, the following information is being sent to you regarding the precast yard.

A precast yard was not included in the final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) prepared for the Honolulu High-Capacity Transit Corridor Project because it was not reasonably foreseeable as to whether one would be needed for the Project; or if one was required, where it would be located. Consequently, there were no significant environmental impacts to evaluate related to a precast yard.

The contractor for the first construction phase of the Project, the West Oahu/Farrington Highway portion, is considering its options regarding the sources of casted elements for the Project, including whether the precast elements could be purchased from a supplier rather than establishing a yard specifically for the casting operation. At the present time, the contractor has suspended all work, discussions and consideration of developing a casting yard.

As requested, the following information is provided regarding the Kalaeloa Site and Hoopili Maintenance and Storage Facility Site.
