Liz, In response to your TCPs were evaluated at the appropriate level in the Cultural Resources Technical Report, August 15, 2008 (available on the project website). Here is the language on TCPs from the FEIS.

Traditional Cultural Properties

The City will conduct a study to identify and evaluate the APE for the presence of traditional cultural properties (TCP). If FTA determines that TCPs are eligible for the NRHP, the City will meet with the Section 106 consulting parties to identify measures to avoid, minimize, and mitigate adverse effects (see Appendix H). (FEIS page 4-182)

Traditional Cultural Properties

The Chinatown Historic District is listed in the NRHP and is likely a TCP. Further investigation for TCPs is being completed as stipulated in the draft PA, which is included in Appendix H. (page 4-191 of the FEIS)
