Hi Ted and Ray –

I just copied you on an email to the State Historic Preservation Division people (Pua Aiu and Nancy McMahon) regarding tomorrow's meeting on the Section 106 Programmatic Agreement. I know that Ted may not be able to participate in the call, but I was wondering if there would be someone from FTA on the phone call. The call in number is as follows: 1-888-742-8686, Confirmation ID 3784294. At last week's meeting, someone asked if FTA was participating. I responded that the City is representing FTA. Also, when we had the informal meeting with ACHP, it was remarked that at this point in the Section 106 process, FTA should be taking a greater role. Attached is a list of those who participated in the last meeting.

We would definitely like to have a conference call with you and SHPD after tomorrow's meeting and before the third meeting to make certain that the stipulations included in the final PA are acceptable to the signatories. Please let me know when would be a good time and so I can make the necessary arrangements.

August 11th would be the 15th day after the ACHP received the notification of adverse effect and so they should be able to tell us if they will be a signatory. Have you responded to the Oahu Island Burial Council and the Office of Hawaiian Affairs regarding their request to be signatories? Would you like us to prepare a response for you?

Also, FYI, we have not received the supplemental comments from National Park Service regarding the Pearl Harbor National Historic Landmark. Elaine Jackson-Retondo thought that it may be signed this past Friday.
