The 1.2 million-member Disabled American Veterans (DAV) is a non-profit 501(c)(4) charity dedicated to building better lives for America's disabled veterans and their families.

In addition to a memorial, the DAV memorial site includes the John Burns Memorial Hall, which may be rented for private events.

The attached plan sheet shows that the project would cross over the entrance road, but would not affect any property within the fenceline. The City has been in contact with the DAV and they have indicated that they have no concerns as long as the project crosses their entry road without affecting it and is outside of the fenceline.
