I am requesting a bit of guidance and clarification on response to comments received on the EISPN and project scoping. After reading HAR 11-200-15 and consulting with colleagues, I would like your guidance. For the Honolulu High-Capacity Transit Corridor Project, which was noted in last weeks Environmental Notice, we are right in the middle of the EISPN comment period.

We are preparing a scoping report that will include all comments received during scoping, a summary of all of the comments, and response to the comments. We are proposing to address the requirement of HAR 11-200-15(d) for response to each comment by sending a copy of the scoping report to everyone who sent in a comment letter or provided an oral comment, and to provide it on the web, along with an e-mail notification of its availability to everyone who sent a comment via the web.
