Financial Feasibility of Rail

Proposed Procedures:

1. Questions for the presenters may be presented in writing either in advance of the meeting or at the check-in desk outside of the room prior to the start of the meeting.
2. Meeting will be conducted by CAC Chair Dave Arakawa.
3. Chair Arakawa will offer a brief summary of the meeting format to attendees and present ground rules.
4. Each presenter, Toru Hamayasu and Cliff Slater, will provide a 10-15 minute presentation on the financial feasibility of either rail or a proposed alternative to rail.
5. A Question-and-Answer period will follow the presentations, with three (3) written questions put forth by Chair Arakawa. *Preference will be given to questions posed by CAC members.* The presenters will take turns being the first and second person to respond to questions. For example, the order of responses to the first three written questions would be as follows:
 - a. Question 1: Mr. Slater will be given one (1) minute to respond to the question. Mr. Hamayasu will then be given one (1) minute to respond to the same question.
 - b. Question 2: Mr. Hamayasu will be given one (1) minute to respond to the question. Mr. Slater will then be given one (1) minutes to respond to the same question.
 - c. Question 3: Mr. Slater will be given one (1) minute to respond to the question. Mr. Hamayasu will then be given one (1) minute to respond to the same question.
6. The Chair will then recognize two (2) audience members (*preference will be given to questions posed by CAC members*) for verbal questions. Each audience member asking a verbal question will be given 30 seconds to pose their question.
 - a. Following each audience member's question, each presenter will be given one (1) minute to respond to the question.

- b. As in the written question section, the presenters will take turns responding to the same verbal question, continuing to alternate first and second responses. For example, for the first audience question, the first to respond would be Mr. Hamayasu; the second to respond would be Mr. Slater. The first responder to the second audience question would be Mr. Slater, etc.).
7. The Question-and-Answer sequence, alternating between three (3) written and two (2) verbal questions, will continue until 4:45 p.m. At that time, Mr. Slater and then Mr. Hamayasu will each be given 5 minutes for closing remarks with an opportunity for a response by each presenter no longer than 2 minutes in duration.
