Hi Lynn -

Tried calling your number, but kept getting JoAnn Higuchi's message.

I need your help in understanding the situation with the Navy Ewa Drum Storage Site and guidance as to what course of action we should take. As I mentioned when we last spoke, we would like to do a site recon of the site, followed by survey and geotechnical drilling work.

Kevin Wong of PB Americas, our general engineering consultant, has been in contact with Shayne Hirayama to see if we could get access to the site for a site recon (walk through). It was originally scheduled for this past Monday, but for some reason it was cancelled.

According to PB Americas, per Genie Wery, DHHL has requested that we channel any requests for Right of Entry (ROE) to the Navy Drum site through them. I have been talking to DHHL to see how I should request a ROE for the site. I first called Patrick Kubota and was later referred to Todd Gray, the land agent for DHHL. I just spoke with Todd this morning. He confirmed that the property transfer has not been completed and so the ROE needs to come from the Navy. He also told me that Genie Wery has indicated that in order to process the ROE, she would need to delay her work on the property transfer. We were given the same information a few months ago and therefore did not pursue getting a ROE until after August. Today, Todd told me that he would like us to wait until after December to pursue the ROE. When I told him that we would like to be able to do the survey and geotechnical drilling work earlier, he said that he would need to discuss the matter with the DHHL Chairman, because if DHHL requests the ROE, it would then result in a delay to the property transfer.
