Historic Hawaii Foundation has requested substantial mitigation, which has been provided by the project. An early request was for the City to become a certified local government. In lieu of that measure, a 2 million dollar mitigation fund is established per the request of HHF and the NTHP. The below table provides a summary response to issues raised by Historic Hawaii Foundation in November 5, 2009 comments

<u>Request</u>	<u>Response</u>
Provide details of adverse effects within the PA.	These are detailed in Historic Effects Report, which is available as reference.
What Federal Agencies own land and will they sign the PA?	Several federal agencies own land, including USPS, GSA, Navy, and Air Force. Each may elect to adopt PA. Neither the FTA nor the City can force any agency to sign onto the PA.
Several questions about Native Hawaiian Burials	This issue is being coordinated with the OIBC.
Suggestions regarding design to Secretary of Interior Standards,	The approach to addressing Secretary of Interior Standards was provided by the ACHP and is not being changed to HHF's proposal.
Suggested revision to SHPD approvals, review timelines, and consultation meetings.	Approvals, timelines, and consultation process follow federal requirements and were established through the consultation process. They are not being revised now at the end of the process.
Specify that replacement trees shall be at least 12-inch caliper when planted.	Replacement trees shall be as established as required by landscaping and tree replacement plans. Landscaping plans have not been completed.
PA duration should be extended.	Duration established per ACHP direction. PA has been revised to state that it will be in effect to complete all commitments specified in the PA.
Desire to see another copy of attachments.	All attachments have previously been distributed. An APE boundary line is being added to Attachment 1 and it will again be

distributed with Final PA.
