As impertinent questions go, that's a pretty good one.

I'd characterize FTA's view as one that has Jacobs in a review role, looking at whatever you produce. Jacobs' recommendations are technically just that -- recommendations to FTA. So, FTA anticipates that you will continue to develop your own forecasts of escalation -- and everything else.

But I'm not sure there's anyone in FTA who will disagree with recommendations made by our PMOCs. We are very highly dependent on the contractors for expertise, as you have probably recognized. So, there's a reasonable likelihood that Jacob's recommendations will become FTA's mandates.

Not a pretty picture.
