

## HART Architectural Historian Position Description

The Architectural Historian will support the Honolulu Rail Transit Project (the H RTP) for the purposes of fulfilling the stipulations set forth in the H RTP, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, Programmatic Agreement (PA), Stipulations I.G. and VI.E. Responsibilities will be carried out through the completion of H RTP construction (estimated through 2019).

This is a part-time position as described, with the expectation of 20 hours/per week.

### **Position Requirements**

Meets the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards set forth in 36 CFR 61, Appendix A.

The minimum professional qualifications in architectural history are a graduate degree in architectural history, art history, historic preservation, or closely related field, with coursework in American architectural history, or a bachelor's degree in architectural history, art history, historic preservation or closely related field plus one of the following:

- At least two years of full-time experience in research, writing, or teaching in American architectural history or restoration architecture with an academic institution, historical organization or agency, museum, or other professional institution; or
- Substantial contribution through research and publication to the body of scholarly knowledge in the field of American architectural history.

### **Duties**

- Per stipulation I.G. – coordinating Section 106 H RTP activities with the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) to ensure consideration of historic preservation in transit oriented development (TOD) and other development projects along the H RTP corridor.
- Per stipulation IX.A - The architectural historian shall oversee completion of the stipulations of this PA, coordinate with the SHPD, Kako'o and other consulting parties, and coordinate with the Department of Planning and Permitting (DPP) regarding land use planning activities, including the integration of TOD with historic preservation in the vicinity of H RTP stations.
  - Consult with State Historic Preservation Division (SHPD) and Consulting Parties on issues and various products produced in relationship to TOD planning at stations.
  - Coordinate and consolidate review comments of various reports, surveys and studies submitted by Consulting Parties, PA signatories and others as identified in the PA as associated with TOD planning.
  - Review guideway and station design plans to ensure adherence to mitigation as specified in the PA as associated with TOD planning.
  - Coordinate with HART and DPP TOD staff concerning preservation of historic properties within the vicinity of H RTP stations.
  - Conducts site visits as needed to assess the effect of the H RTP on historic properties and to ensure mitigation plans are properly implemented.

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- Attends functions that have opportunities to highlight historic preservation and TOD.
- Performs other duties and special projects as assigned.
  
- Per stipulation VI.A – E. - based on professional qualifications identified above, prepare and/or review (when prepared by others) Hawaii, National Register of Historic Places and National Historic Landmark Nominations as identified in Stipulation VI: Multiple Property Documentation, US Navy Pearl Harbor and CINCPAC NHL updates, NRHP nomination forms and/or amendments for 31 properties, and Makalapa Navy Housing and Little Makalapa Navy Housing District nomination forms.
- Related to stipulation VII - provide input and coordination support for the preparation of educational and interpretative programs, informational materials and signage for use at transit stations, vehicles, and schools in association with TOD planning.
- Related to stipulation VIII - Provide input and coordination support for the development mitigation to specific historic properties and a park improvement plan to address adversely affected parks due to the HRTP to the extent it may overlap with TOD planning.
- Per stipulation IX.C - monitor and report proposed demolition of resources built before 1969 within the APE and within a 2,000 foot radius of each station.
