

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL INVENTORY SURVEY?

- The results of the archaeological survey will inform the project design phasing for the purpose of avoiding and protecting archaeological finds
- The goal is to perform archaeological testing in a way that allows the project to have the least possible effect on archaeological finds
- All archaeological finds will be considered previously identified, and treatment decisions will include appropriate consultation with the O`ahu Island Burial Council (OIBC), State Historic Preservation Division (SHPD), and cultural and lineal descendents
- Consultation with interested parties will continue throughout the entire process





ARCHAEOLOGICAL INVENTORY SURVEY CITY CENTER



The Honolulu Rail Transit Project will conduct an Archaeological Inventory Survey (AIS) from the Middle Street Transit Center station in Kalihi to the Ala Moana Center station. The AIS process utilizes ground penetrating radar and trenching methods to explore and excavate underground areas for potential archaeological finds. Day, evening and night work will begin soon and continue through summer 2012.

Residents and motorists can anticipate:

- **Crews working during day, evening and night hours between 8:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.**
- **Lane closures during non-peak hours**
- **At least one lane of traffic in each direction will remain open on all major streets**






MAP A: Middle Street to Kalihi Street



MAP B: Kalihi Street to Alakawa Street




MAP C: Alakawa Street to Smith Street




MAP D: Smith Street to Keawe Street
