The community-based Waipahu Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) Plan focuses on the areas around two rail transit stations--the West Loch Station and the Waipahu Transit Center Station--at the intersections of Farrington Highway/Leoku Street and Farrington Highway/Mokuola Street, respectively.

Some of the community's ideas for neighborhood improvements and future urban development near those stations include new mini-parks, open spaces and multi-family housing.

Honolulu City Councilmember Breene Harimoto and the Department of Planning and Permitting will hold a community meeting to discuss the Waipahu Neighborhood TOD plan Tuesday, February 4 at 7:00 p.m. at the Waipahu Intermediate School cafeteria.

*HART RECEIVES \$43 MILLION IN GET COLLECTIONS
FOR RAIL*

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) received more than \$43 million in General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenue for the fourth quarter of 2013.

With the receipt of the \$43.49 million for the months of October, November and December, the total GET revenue for the Honolulu rail project now stands at \$1.18 billion.

The half-percent GET surcharge dedicated to the Honolulu rail system was levied beginning in January 2007 and is set to expire at the end of 2022. It is estimated the surcharge will fund nearly 70 percent of the project's cost, with the remainder to be covered with federal funding.

TRAFFIC ALERT



Farrington Highway in Ewa between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is closed in both directions until April.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway east of the Kunia Road overpass will be closed from Sunday, February 2 to Thursday, February 6 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m. and west of the overpass from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

The Fort Weaver Road northbound off-ramp onto Farrington Highway will be closed from Sunday, February 2 to Thursday, February 6 between 9 p.m. and 4 a.m.

In Waipahu, the westbound lanes of Farrington Highway between Leoku and Leokane streets will be closed from Sunday, February 2 to Thursday, February 6 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. Eastbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane.

In Pearl City, two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street, including the left-turn lane into Home Depot, will be closed from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Also in Pearl City, lanes along Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed overnight from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. One westbound lane will remain open and westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There'll be no left turns at the Kuleana Road intersection.

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha and Kanuku streets near Best Buy and the eastbound left-turn lane at the intersection of Kamehameha Highway and Kanuku Street will be

closed until mid-March.


One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in that same vicinity will also be closed Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. and two westbound lanes and an additional eastbound lane between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

The inside lane of the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp to the H-1 along Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium will be closed from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. and again from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. In addition, the freeway on-ramp will be closed from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

In Kalihi, both the eastbound and westbound left lanes of Kamehameha Highway from Laumaka Street to Kalihi Street will be closed from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

And in Kakaako, Halekauwila Street will be closed between Ala Moana Boulevard and Punchbowl Street from Monday, February 3 to Friday, February 7 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m. The eastbound right lane of Halekauwila will also be closed between 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. between Punchbowl Street and South Street.
