TRAIN CAR REPLICA DISPLAY EXTENDED AT KAPOLEI HALE



The HART train car model will remain at Kapolei Hale through the end of the year.

The replica of the train car for Honolulu's rail transit system, on display at Kapolei Hale since mid-February, will remain there through the end of the year.

More than 5,000 people have visited the model so far. Informational videos about the rail project and the route the trains will travel from Kapolei to Ala Moana Center are featured inside.

Honolulu's rail system will consist of a fleet of 80 cars. Each four-car train will have the capacity to carry 800 passengers and will feature free Wi-Fi, air conditioning and room for luggage, bikes, surfboards and wheelchairs.

TRAFFIC ALERT



The right westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway near the intersection of Acacia Road fronting Pearl Highlands Center (see above map) will be closed this weekend and is scheduled to reopen Monday afternoon, May 5. U-turns from eastbound Kamehameha Highway at the Acacia Road intersection will be restricted for safety.



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is open again in both directions. Rail construction work continues in the area and motorists are advised to drive safely.

H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Crews will be working within the H-1 Freeway median at the H-1/H-2 merge from Sunday, May 4 to Thursday, May 8 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. One eastbound lane of the H-1 Freeway will be closed during that time. The contractor will temporarily close a second eastbound H-1 lane after 9 p.m. for approximately four hours to move construction equipment out of the median area.

WAIPAHAU

One lane of Farrington Highway in each direction between the Kunia Road overpass and Pupukahi Street will be closed from Monday, May 5 to Friday, May 9 between 6:30 p.m. and 7:30 a.m. Westbound lanes of Farrington Highway between Leoku Street and Leokane Street will be closed Tuesday, May 6 during those same hours.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway near the intersection of Aniani Place fronting

Waipahu Intermediate School will be closed from Tuesday, May 6 to Friday, May 9 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Alternating eastbound and westbound lane closures along Farrington Highway near the Waipahu Depot Road intersection are scheduled from Tuesday, May 6 to Thursday, May 8 between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m., near Mokuola Street from Monday, May 5 to Friday, May 9 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. and near Kahualii Street from Monday, May 5 to Friday, May 9 between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street will be closed from Monday, May 5 to Friday, May 9 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed from Monday, May 5 to Friday, May 9 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There will be no left turns allowed at the Kuleana Road intersection.

AIEA

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed through the end of the month.

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street remains closed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in that same vicinity will also be closed from Monday, May 5 to Sunday, May 11 between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Salt Lake Boulevard will be closed 24/7 until further notice.

DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO

On Saturday, May 3 and Sunday, May 4 between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. the left eastbound shoulder of Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and Punchbowl Street, and Halekauwila Street in both directions between Punchbowl Street and South Street, will be closed.

Left lanes of Nimitz Highway in both directions between Sumner Street and Punchbowl Street will be closed from Sunday, May 4 to Thursday, May 8 between 9 p.m. and 4 a.m.

The westbound lane of Pohukaina Street between Keawe Street and South Street will be closed from Monday, May 5 to Wednesday, May 7 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The left eastbound and westbound lanes of Queen Street between Cummins Street and Waimanu Street will be closed Monday, May 5 to Friday, May 9 between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

And from Sunday, May 4 to Thursday, May 8 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m., the right westbound lane of Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and Punchbowl Street and

the right eastbound lane of Halekauwila Street between Punchbowl Street and South Street will be closed.
