COMPANIES READY TO WORK ON RAIL PROJECT

More than 250 representatives from 145 companies turned out for HART's second Industry Day earlier this week at the Honolulu Country Club in Salt Lake.

Industry Day brought together big prime contracting companies and local businesses so they could learn the latest information about the construction contracts worth more than \$1 billion that HART plans to put out to bid in the coming months.

Honolulu Mayor Kirk Caldwell, Honolulu City Council Chair Ernest Martin, HART Board Chairman Ivan Lui-Kwan and HART Executive Director and CEO Dan Grabauskas provided opening remarks.

HART presented an update on rail construction opportunities and conducted a question-and-answer session.

"Industry Day has become an excellent way for local contractors to connect with HART and with other contractors to learn about upcoming contracts for work on the rail project,"

Grabauskas said. "It is one of several ways we encourage broad participation and help create local job opportunities within the project."

TRAFFIC ALERT



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort

Weaver Road is open again in both directions. Rail construction work continues in the area and motorists will need to take a slight detour along Old Fort Weaver Road near Kahi Mohala.

Left turns from Farrington Highway onto Fort Weaver Road northbound will be restricted 24/7 beginning Monday, May 12. Drivers using Farrington Highway eastbound will need to take a detour onto Leoku Street and Leolua Street to access Fort Weaver Road. Work is expected to last approximately 8 weeks.

H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Crews will be working within the H-1 Freeway median at the H-1/H-2 merge from Sunday, May 11 to Thursday, May 15 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. One eastbound lane of the H-1 Freeway will be closed during that time. The contractor will temporarily close a second eastbound H-1 lane after 9 p.m. for approximately four hours to move construction equipment out of the median area.

WAIPAHU

The eastbound lanes of Farrington Highway near Kahualii Street and Waipahu High School will be closed between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway in each direction between the Kunia Road overpass and Pupukahi Street will be closed from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway near the intersection of Aniani Place fronting Waipahu Intermediate School will be closed from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Alternating inside and outside lane closures along Farrington Highway near Mokuola Street will take place from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street and between Waimano Home Road and Puu Poni Street will be closed from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16 between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There will be no left turns allowed at the Kuleana Road intersection.

AIEA

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed through the end of the month.

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street remains closed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in that same vicinity will also be closed from Monday, May 12 to Sunday, May 18 between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Salt Lake Boulevard will be closed 24/7 until further notice.

Alternating lanes closures will take place along the inside and outside lanes of Kamehameha Highway in the same vicinity between 8 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. from Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16. One lane of traffic in each direction will remain open.

DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO

On Saturday, May 10 and Sunday, May 11 between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. the left eastbound shoulder of Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and Punchbowl Street, and Halekauwila Street in both directions between Punchbowl Street and South Street, will be closed.

Left lanes of Nimitz Highway in both directions between Sumner Street and Punchbowl Street will be closed from Sunday, May 11 to Thursday, May 15 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

And there'll be intermittent lane closures of the right eastbound lane of Nimitz Highway between Sumner Street and Nuuanu Avenue and the right westbound lane of Nimitz from River Street to near Iwilei Road from Wednesday, May 14 to Friday, May 16 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. and again between 8:30 p.m. and 4:30 a.m.

The westbound lane of Pohukaina Street between Keawe Street and South Street will be closed from Monday, May 5 to Wednesday, May 7 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The left eastbound and westbound lanes of Queen Street between Cummins Street and Pensacola Street will be closed Monday, May 12 to Friday, May 16 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The right westbound lane of Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and Punchbowl Street and the right eastbound lane of Halekauwila Street between Punchbowl Street and South Street will be closed from Sunday, May 11 to Thursday, May 15 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.
