GREEN TRANSPORTATION

HART Executive Director and CEO Dan Grabauskas will be one of the featured presenters at the 2013 Hawaii Build and Buy Green Conference and Expo next Friday, May 10th at the Hawaii Convention Center.

Grabauskas will provide the Conference with an update on the Honolulu Rail Transit Project as part of the Clean Energy and Green Infrastructure portion of the program.

The Honolulu Rail Transit Project will use electric-powered rail technologies that produce about 75 percent less in greenhouse gas emissions per passenger mile than private automobiles. By 2030, Honolulu's rail system will help take about 40,000 vehicles off our roads each weekday. So, in addition to providing a clean energy alternative to driving, rail will also help preserve green spaces by focusing development in the urban core and reducing carbon emissions related to transportation.

BUDGET BRIEF

The Honolulu City Council will hold a special Budget Committee meeting next Thursday, May 9. Councilmembers are reviewing the HART Budget for the next fiscal year which begins on July 1.

HART has submitted a \$21 million dollar operating budget for the coming year and a construction budget of \$1.34 billion.

Both the full Council and the HART Board of Directors are expected to approve the final version of the HART budgets next month.

TRAFFIC UPDATE - AIRPORT SECTION



Crews will be doing some design work for the rail project next week in the Pearl Harbor and airport areas that will require some lane closures and parking restrictions.

Lane closures are scheduled for Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam to the H-1 Freeway on-ramp westbound, and on Kamehameha Highway between Ford Island Boulevard and Arizona Memorial Place, also in the westbound direction, between 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m.

Curbside parking will be restricted from 8:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. on Ualena Street between Ohohia Street and Lagoon Drive, and also along Waiwai Loop.
