STADIUM GOERS WILL ENJOY THE ALOHA STADIUM RAIL STATION



In the future, people will take the train to the Aloha Stadium Station to attend the Pro Bowl, college and high school sporting events and the Aloha Stadium Swap Meet.

The stars of the National Football League have come to Honolulu this week as part of the NFL's annual Pro Bowl celebration.

Nearly 50,000 fans, local residents and visitors alike, are expected to attend the Pro Bowl at Aloha Stadium. TheBus is providing express shuttle service to the game.

And in just a few short years, many fans will be able to take the train to the Aloha Stadium station for the Pro Bowl, riding in air-conditioned comfort, avoiding traffic congestion and saving money on gas and parking.

The Aloha Stadium station will be one of three stations featured at a community informational meeting scheduled for Wednesday, January 29 at the Highlands Intermediate School cafeteria. HART staff members will also present the latest designs for the Pearl Highlands and Pearlridge stations. Doors open at 6 p.m. and the meeting gets underway at 6:30.

That meeting will follow by one night the West Oahu station group meeting at the Kapolei Middle School cafeteria where people can weigh in on the designs for the East Kapolei and UH-West Oahu stations. Meeting time is 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, January 28.

COLUMN CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



Workers continue to build the columns in West Oahu that will support the rail system guideway. So far, 46 columns and more than 50 foundations have been constructed.

Utility relocation work and geotechnical soil testing are also underway along several sections of the alignment.

And work will soon begin on the foundations for the buildings at the operations and maintenance site near Leeward Community College.

TRAFFIC ALERT



Farrington Highway in Ewa between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is closed in both directions until April.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway near the Kunia Road overpass will be closed from Sunday, January 26 to Thursday, January 30 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

And the Farrington Highway westbound left-turn lane onto the Fort Weaver Road southbound ramp will be closed overnight from Sunday, January 26 to Thursday, January 30 between 7 p.m. and 3 p.m. the following afternoons.

In Waipahu, one eastbound lane of Farrington Highway fronting Waipahu High School near Kahualii Street will be closed from Sunday, January 26 to Thursday, January 30 between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

In Pearl City, two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street, including the left-turn lane into Home Depot, will be closed from Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Also in Pearl City, lanes along Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed overnight from Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. One westbound lane will remain open and westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane during the closure.

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha and Kanuku streets near Best Buy and the eastbound left-turn lane at the intersection of Kamehameha Highway and Kanuku Street will be closed until mid-March.

One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in that same vicinity will also be closed Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. and two westbound lanes and an additional eastbound lane between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

The inside lane of the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp to the H-1 along Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium will be closed from Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. and again from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. In addition, the on-ramp will be closed from Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 10 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.


Lane closures in Kalihi will take place at the following locations from Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

- Kamehameha Highway between Middle Street and Mokauea Street
- Kaaahi Street between Dillingham Boulevard and Kaaahi Place

Lane closures in Kaka`ako will take place at the following locations from Monday, January 27 to Friday, January 31 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

- Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and South Street
- Halekauwila Street between Coral Street and South Street
