SATELLITE CITY HALL FEATURES RAIL DISPLAY

HART has a new rail transit informational display in the lobby entrance of the Ala Moana Satellite City Hall.

The large wall display includes a map of the 20-mile rail route, the locations of the 21 rail stations and 4 park-and-ride facilities and facts and figures about many of the operational details and features of the rail system.



Also on display is a model of the system's West Loch rail station in Waipahu.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION HAS RECORD-SETTING YEAR



Miami's elevated rail system was one of several across the country that showed increased ridership in 2013.

For public transportation in the United States, 2013 was a record-setting year. Americans took 10.7 billion trips on their buses, trains and trolleys---the highest public transportation ridership in 57 years.

The American Public Transportation Association (APTA) annually publishes ridership data collected from transit agencies all across the country.

The figures show an increase nationally of 2.8 percent for ridership on grade-separated rail systems, which include both elevated rail and subways. Some of the cities with grade-separated systems that showed increased ridership over 2012 were Miami, Cleveland, Los Angeles and New York. Seattle, San Diego, Denver and Salt Lake City also reported increased ridership on their rail systems.

Bus ridership in 2013 was basically flat, with a 0.1 percent decline nationally. Ridership on Honolulu's TheBus was up just slightly last year, while demand for Handi-Van Service grew by 3.5%.

TRAFFIC ALERT



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is closed in both directions through April.

There will be staggered closures of eastbound and westbound lanes of Farrington Highway between the Kunia Road overpass and Old Fort Weaver Road Loop from Sunday, March 16 to Saturday, March 22. Motorists may be diverted to a temporary lane.

H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

The left eastbound lane of the H-1 Freeway at the Waiawa Interchange (H-1/H-2 merge) will be closed from Sunday, March 16 at 8 p.m. until 4 a.m. Monday morning, March 17.

WAIPAHU

The westbound lanes of Farrington Highway east of the Kunia overpass will be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

The westbound lanes of Farrington Highway between Waikele Road and Pupukahi Street will be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. Westbound drivers will be diverted to a temporary lane during the closure.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street, including the left-turn lane into Home Depot, will be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. One westbound lane will remain open and westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There will be no left turns allowed at the Kuleana Road intersection. Two westbound lanes in the same area will also be closed weekdays between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Puu Poni Street will be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 from 8 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

AIEA

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed through the end of March.

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street will be closed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. An additional eastbound and two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway will be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 from 7:30 p.m. to 5:30 a.m. One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway will be closed on Friday, March 21 and Saturday, March 22 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

SALT LAKE/ALOHA STADIUM

The H-1/Moanalua Freeway on-ramp along Kamehameha Highway near

Aloha Stadium will be closed overnight from Wednesday, March 19 to Friday, March 21 between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. One lane of the on-ramp will also be closed from Monday, March 17 to Friday, March 21 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

KALIHI/IWILEI

Both the eastbound and westbound left lanes of Dillingham Boulevard between Waiakamilo Road and Alakawa Street will be closed from Sunday, March 16 to Thursday, March 20 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO

The eastbound and westbound left lanes of Nimitz Highway between River Street and Punchbowl Street will be closed from Sunday, March 16 to Thursday, March 20 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

Punchbowl Street between Pohukaina Street and Ala Moana Boulevard will be closed on Saturday, March 15 and Sunday, March 16 between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. Motorists are advised to use either Halekauwila Street or Pohukaina Street as detours.
