

HART ANSWERS YOUR QUESTIONS



The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) participates in more than 200 presentations, community meetings and events each year, connecting with the community. Some of the most frequently asked questions we hear deal with train operations. Here are three of the most frequently asked questions and answers:

Q:How often will the trains arrive?

A:HART's four-car trains will arrive about every 5 minutes during peak times, and about every 10 minutes during non peak travel times. The frequency can also be adjusted to accommodate major community events, including events at the Aloha Stadium or in urban Honolulu.

Q:How much will it cost to ride?

A:The rail system will be integrated with the city bus system and have a single systemwide fare. Although the actual fares have not yet been set, the plan is to keep fares affordable, like TheBus, and to provide the same pass discounts for seniors, persons with disabilities and students.

Q:When will the system open for operation?

A: The first 10 miles of the system, from the East Kapolei station to the Aloha Stadium station will be open in 2017. This will serve travelers going to the Aiea, Pearl City, Waipahu and Kapolei areas.

The entire 20-mile system and its 21 stations, from Kapolei to Ala Moana Center, is scheduled to begin operating in 2019. The route includes stops at the Honolulu International Airport, several college campuses, downtown Honolulu's business center, as well as entertainment venues such as shopping centers and Aloha Stadium.

TRAFFIC ALERT



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is closed in both directions through April.

WAIPAHU

Lanes of Farrington Highway between the Kunia Road overpass and Leokane Street, as well as the intersection of Farrington and Leoku Street, will be closed from Monday,

March 31 to Friday, April 4 between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m.

The westbound lanes of Farrington Highway between Waikele Road and Pupukahi Street will be closed from Monday, March 31 to Friday, April 4 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. Westbound drivers will be diverted to a temporary lane.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway near Aniani Place fronting Waipahu Intermediate School will be closed from Monday, March 31 to Friday, April 4 between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. There will also be intermittent closures of the Aniani Place-Farrington Highway intersection during those work hours.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street and between Waimano Home Road and Puu Poni Street will be closed from Monday, March 31 to Friday, April 4 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. The Waimano Home Road intersection will be closed overnight Tuesday beginning at 9 p.m. The Acacia Road intersection will be closed overnight Thursday beginning at 9 p.m.

Lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed from Monday, March 31 to Friday, April 4 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. One westbound lane will remain open and westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There will be no left turns allowed at the Kuleana Road intersection.

AIEA

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed through mid-April.

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street remains closed 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

KALIHI/IWILEI

Both the eastbound and westbound left lanes of Dillingham Boulevard between Laumaka Street and North King Street and between McNeill Street and Kokea Street will be closed from Sunday, March 30 to Thursday, April 3 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO

The eastbound and westbound left lanes of Nimitz Highway between Nuuanu Avenue and Kekaulike Street will be closed from Sunday, March 30 to Thursday, April 3 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

Punchbowl Street between Pohukaina Street and Ala Moana Boulevard will be closed on Saturday, March 29 and Sunday, March 30 between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. Motorists are advised to use either Halekauwila Street or Pohukaina Street as detours.


