FARRINGTON HIGHWAY SET TO REOPEN



HART plans to reopen a stretch of Farrington Highway in Ewa next week.

Good news for Leeward Oahu commuters.

HART is pleased to announce that Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road Loop is scheduled to be reopened in both directions beginning at 5 a.m. next Wednesday, April 30... in time for the morning commute.

The two-lane stretch of Farrington Highway has been closed since last November so that work crews could safely relocate several major utility lines and conduct shaft and column work for the rail guideway.

"We want to say a big mahalo to those folks who endured our closure of this stretch of Farrington Highway over these past few months," said HART Executive Director and CEO Dan Grabauskas. "We really appreciate their patience."


HART TO RECEIVE \$61 MILLION IN GET COLLECTIONS

The Honolulu Authority for Rapid Transportation (HART) will receive more than \$61 million in General Excise and Use Tax (GET) revenue for the first quarter of 2014.

With the receipt of the \$61.65 million for the months of January, February and March, the total GET revenue for the Honolulu rail project now stands at \$1.25 billion.

The half-percent GET surcharge dedicated to the Honolulu rail system was levied beginning in January 2007 and is set to expire at the end of 2022. It is estimated the surcharge will fund nearly 70 percent of the project's cost, with the remainder to be covered with federal funding.

TRAFFIC ALERT



The right westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway near the intersection of Acacia Road fronting Pearl Highlands Center (see above map) will be closed 24 hours a day for one week beginning Monday morning, April 28 and continuing to Monday, May 5. U-turns from eastbound Kamehameha Highway at the Acacia Road intersection will be restricted for safety.



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is closed in both directions and is scheduled to reopen 5 a.m. Wednesday, April 30.

H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Crews will be working within the H-1 Freeway median at the H-1/H-2 merge from Sunday, April 27 to Thursday, May 1 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m. Westbound lane closures begin at 10 p.m. One left eastbound lane of the H-1 Freeway may be closed during that time.

WAIPAHU

One lane of Farrington Highway in each direction between the Kunia Road overpass and Pupukahi Street, as well as the intersections of Farrington Highway at Leoku Street and Leokane Street, will be closed from Monday, April 28 to Friday, May 2 between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

The right westbound lane of Farrington Highway near Waipahu High School will be closed from Monday, April 28 to Friday, May 2 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m. Drivers will be diverted to a temporary lane. The right eastbound lane of Farrington Highway near Awanui Street will also be closed on Monday, April 28 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street will be closed from Monday, April 28 to Friday, May 2 between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. In addition, one eastbound lane will be closed between 8 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed from Monday, April 28 to Friday, May 2 between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m. Westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There will be no left turns allowed at the Kuleana Road intersection.

AIEA

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed through early May.

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street remains closed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in that same vicinity will be closed overnight on weekdays between 8 p.m. and 2 p.m.

The right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Salt Lake Boulevard will be closed 24/7 until further notice.

DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO

On Saturday, April 26 between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. the left eastbound shoulder of Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and Punchbowl Street, and Halekauwila Street in both directions between Punchbowl Street and South Street, will be closed.

Left lanes of Nimitz Highway in both directions between River Street and Punchbowl Street will be closed from Sunday, April 27 to Thursday, May 1 between 9 p.m. and 4 a.m.

The right eastbound lane of Halekauwila Street between Keawe Street and Ward Avenue will be closed from Monday, April 28 to Friday, May 2 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The right southbound lane of Ward Avenue between Queen Street and Halekauwila Street will be closed on Monday, April 28 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Right lanes of Halekauwila Street in both directions between Richards Street and South Street will be closed from Sunday, April 27 to Thursday, May 1 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m. The right eastbound lanes of Queen Street from Ward Avenue to the intersection of Queen and Waimanu Streets will also be closed during those hours.
