RAIL CONSTRUCTION WORK UPDATE



The rail construction most people see is in Ewa where the columns that will support the rail guideway continue to be built. Workers have now constructed more than 90 columns along Kualakai Parkway and Farrington Highway. Soon they will cross Fort Weaver Road and more columns will be built in Waipahu. And work is continuing throughout the 20-mile alignment.



At the same time, the segments that will form the guideway and sit atop the columns are being manufactured at Kiewit's precast yard in Kalaeloa. Workers produce about a dozen of the 50-ton segments daily. The precast segments are then transported by truck to the site of the columns, where they are hoisted one by one and fitted together to form the concrete span between the columns. It will take about 5,200 segments to make up the first 10 miles of the alignment.

TRAFFIC ALERT



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road is open in both directions. Rail construction work continues in the area and motorists will need to take a slight detour along Old Fort Weaver Road near Kahi Mohala.

Left turns from Farrington Highway onto Fort Weaver Road northbound are restricted 24/7. Drivers using Farrington Highway eastbound will need to take a detour onto Leoku Street to access Fort Weaver Road through either Leolua Street or Waipahu Street. The detour is expected to run until mid-July.

H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Crews will be working within the H-1 Freeway median at the H-1/H-2 merge from Sunday, May 18 to Thursday, May 22. The two left eastbound lanes of the H-1 Freeway in that area will be closed overnight until 4 a.m., with the first lane to close at 8 p.m. and the second at 9 p.m.

WAIPAHU

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway in both directions between the Fort Weaver Road overpass and Leoku Street will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway in both directions between the Kunia Road overpass and Pupukahi Street will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway near the intersection of Aniani Place fronting Waipahu Intermediate School will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 8 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Alternating inside and outside lane closures along Farrington Highway near Mokuola Street will take place from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

A section of Ala Ike Street fronting the Leeward Community College campus parking lot will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and one eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waimano Home Road and Kuala Street and between Waimano Home Road and Puu Poni Street will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

Two westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Kuleana Road and Puu Poni Street near the HECO-Waiiau power plant will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 8 p.m. and 5:30 a.m. Westbound traffic will be diverted to a temporary lane. There will be no left turns allowed at the Kuleana Road intersection.

AIEA

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed through June.

The left eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street remains closed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in that same vicinity will also be closed from Monday, May 19 to Sunday, May 25 between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The inside lanes of Kamehameha Highway in both directions between Kaonohi and Kanuku streets will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 7 a.m. and 3:30

p.m.

The right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Salt Lake Boulevard will be closed 24/7 until further notice.

Alternating lanes closures will take place along the inside and outside lanes of Kamehameha Highway in the same vicinity between 8 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23. One lane of traffic in each direction will remain open.

The southbound lane of Aiea Access Road between the Moanalua Freeway loop on-ramp and Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium will be closed from Wednesday, May 21 to Friday, May 23 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m.

PEARL HARBOR/AIRPORT

The right eastbound lane of Aolele Street between the Airport Post Office and Aopoko Place will be closed from Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

KALIHI

The inside lanes of Dillingham Boulevard in both directions will be closed intermittently from Wednesday, May 21 to Friday, May 23 between Laumaka Street and Kaaahi Street.

DOWNTOWN/KAKAAKO

On Saturday, May 17 and Sunday, May 18 between 7 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. Halekauwila Street between Richards Street and South Street will be closed.

Left lanes of Nimitz Highway in both directions between Sumner Street and Punchbowl Street and one westbound lane and the eastbound shoulder of Halekauwila Street between Richard Street and Punchbowl Street will be closed from Sunday, May 18 to Thursday, May 22 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.

The left eastbound and westbound lanes of Queen Street between Cummins Street and Pensacola Street will be closed Monday, May 19 to Friday, May 23 between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The right eastbound lane of Halekauwila Street between Punchbowl Street and South Street and the right eastbound lane of Kona Street from Kona Iki Street to Keeaumoku Street will be close from Sunday, May 18 to Thursday, May 22 between 8:30 p.m. and 4 a.m.
