WEEKLY TRAFFIC ALERT



EWA

Farrington Highway between Kualakai Parkway (North-South Road) and Old Fort Weaver Road will be closed Monday, June 30 to Thursday, July 3 between 7 p.m. and 5 a.m. Motorists should instead use either the H-1 Freeway or Kapolei Parkway.

Left turns from Farrington Highway onto Fort Weaver Road northbound will be restricted 24/7 through July. Eastbound drivers using Farrington Highway will need to take a detour up Leoku Street and use either Leolua Street or Waipahu Street to access Fort Weaver Road.

H-1 WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

One southbound lane of the H-2 Freeway near the H-1/H-2 merge will be closed Monday, June 30 to Wednesday, July 2 between 9 p.m. and 4 a.m. On Sunday, June 29, one southbound lane of the H-2 Freeway will be closed at 7 p.m., with a second H-2 lane closed at 8:30 p.m.

WAIPAHU

Westbound lanes of Farrington Highway near Leokane Street will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Thursday, July 3 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Westbound lanes of Farrington Highway near Waipahu Depot Road will also be closed from Monday, June 30 to Thursday, July 3 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

The inside lanes of Farrington Highway between Paiwa Street and Waipahu High School will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Thursday, July 3 between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

PEARL CITY

Two westbound lanes and two eastbound lanes along Kamehameha Highway between Waiawa Road and Kuleana Road will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Friday, July 4 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m. Left turns at the Puu Momi Street and Waimano Home Road intersections will be restricted after 8 p.m.

One westbound and eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Waiawa Road and Waimano Home Road near Home Depot will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Friday, July 4 between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Acacia Road and Waimano Home Road will be closed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

AIEA

The inside eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street near Best Buy is closed 24/7, as is the left eastbound lane between Lipoa Place and Pali Momi Street. The inside eastbound and westbound lanes of Kamehameha Highway between Hekaha Street and Kanuku Street will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Friday, July 4 between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m.

The right eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Salt Lake Boulevard will be closed 24/7 until further notice. One westbound lane of Kamehameha Highway in the area will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Friday, July 4 between 8:30 a.m. and 3 p.m. and between 7:30 p.m. and 5:30 a.m.

Aiea Access Road between the Moanalua Freeway on-ramp and Kamehameha Highway near Aloha Stadium will be closed from Monday, June 30 to Friday, July 4 between 10 p.m. and 4 a.m. Southbound traffic will be detoured onto Moanalua Freeway.

AIRPORT

The left eastbound lane of Aolele Street between the U.S. Post Office and Aopoko Place will be closed from Sunday, June 29 to Thursday July 3 between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m.

KALIHI

Kohou Street along the Dillingham Boulevard end of the street will be closed on Wednesday, July 2 and Thursday, July 3 between 8 p.m. and 4 a.m.
