PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION: A MONEY-SAVING OPTION



With the price of gasoline creeping up again, commuters can save big bucks by using public transportation.

Every month, the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) releases a Transit Savings Report which shows how much a person can save on a monthly and yearly basis by taking public transit.

In Honolulu, individuals who ride public transportation instead of driving can save more than \$12,000 per year.

H-1 FREEWAY WAIAWA INTERCHANGE

Up to three eastbound lanes near the H-1/H-2 merge Sunday night through Friday morning 8 p.m. to 4 a.m.

Up to four westbound lanes 9 p.m. to 4 a.m.

H-1 westbound Waipahu off-ramp 9 p.m. to 4 a.m.

FARRINGTON HIGHWAY NEAR LEEWARD COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Eastbound loop H-2 Freeway on-ramp 9 p.m. and 4 a.m. Sunday night through Friday morning.

Eastbound lanes near Waiawa Road, including on-ramp to Kamehameha Highway, 9 p.m. to 4 a.m. Sunday night through Friday morning.

FARRINGTON HIGHWAY IN WAIPAHU

Outside lanes at various sections in both directions weekdays 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Leoku Street to Leokane Street

Outside lanes from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. weekdays and Saturday as needed.

One of the two left-turn lanes onto Leoku Street 24/7.

Left turns restricted onto Leole Street.

Waipahu Depot Street to Mokuola Street

Westbound lanes weeknights 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Inside lanes weekdays and Saturday as needed 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

West end of Moloalo Street near Mokuola Street 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Pupukahi Street to Aniani Place

Outside lanes weeknights 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

KAMEHAMEHA HIGHWAY IN PEARL CITY

Waiawa Road to Acacia Road

One eastbound lane and one eastbound left-turn lane onto Acacia Road fronting Pearl Highlands Center 24/7.

U-turns permitted at the intersection.

One westbound left-turn lane and inside westbound lane 24/7.

Acacia Road to Waimano Home Road

One eastbound left-turn lane onto Waimano Home Road and inside eastbound lane 24/7.

One westbound left-turn lane onto Lehua Avenue and inside westbound lane 24/7.

U-turns at Waimano Home Road intersection permitted.

Kamehameha Highway to Waiawa Road

Eastbound lanes of Farrington Highway weeknights 7 p.m. to 6 a.m.

Waiawa Road to Waimano Home Road

One westbound lane near Acacia Road weeknights 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

One eastbound lane 7 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

KAMEHAMEHA HIGHWAY IN AIEA AND NEAR ALOHA STADIUM

Kuleana Road to Kaonohi Street

Two westbound lanes weeknights 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Two eastbound lanes 7 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Eastbound lane near Blaisdell Park 24/7.

Inside eastbound lane between Puu Poni Street and Kuleana Road 24/7.

Hekaha Street intersection after 8 p.m. Detour to Kanuku Street and Lokowai Street.

Lipoa Place to Pali Momi Street

Right eastbound lane near the Pearl Kai Shopping Center 24/7.

Two westbound lanes weeknights 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Pali Momi Street intersection weeknights after 8 p.m.

Pali Momi Street to Honomanu Street

Two westbound lanes weeknights 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Near Aloha Stadium

Up to three westbound lanes weeknights 8 p.m. to 7 a.m.

Two eastbound lanes 7 p.m. to 5:30 a.m.

Westbound on-ramp to Moanalua Freeway 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
