HONOLULU FREEWAY COMMUTERS IMPACTED BY TRAFFIC CONGESTION



According to the annual **2015 URBAN MOBILITY SCORECARD** published jointly by the Texas A&M Transportation Institute and INRIX, Honolulu ranks second in the nation in freeway travel time. Only the freeways in Los Angeles are worse.

According to the study, Honolulu has an index of 1.51 which means a given trip on the freeway takes 51% more time than it would without traffic. So what would normally take 40 minutes here instead takes a little more than an hour with traffic.

Honolulu also ranks third in the nation after San Francisco and Los Angeles in what is known as the freeway stress index, which measures the extra travel time for a commuter in the peak direction (town-bound) during the peak period (the morning commute).

Honolulu drivers in 2014 spent an extra 50 hours in traffic due to congestion.

KAMEHAMEHA HIGHWAY IN PEARL HARBOR/AIRPORT AREAS

Kamehameha Highway from Arizona Memorial Place to Arizona Street

One eastbound lane of Kamehameha Highway closed between 8:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Kamehameha Highway from Arizona Street to Makalapa Road/Gate

Up to two eastbound lanes 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Kamehameha Highway from Halawa Drive to Radford Drive

One westbound lane 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Westbound bus stop at Kamehameha Highway and Radford Drive temporarily relocated closer to the intersection 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Kamehameha Highway from Center Drive to Radford Drive

Makai Frontage Road (off ramp) from Kamehameha Highway/Plantation Drive to Valkenburgh Street

One eastbound lane of Nimitz Highway off ramp closed 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

H-1 Freeway (Exit 15A) Westbound to Kamehameha Highway/Center Drive intersection

Single lane of Exit 15A is closed weekdays between 8:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m.

Aolele Street from Aolewa Place to Lagoon Drive

Single westbound lane 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Partial lane closure westbound H-1 on-ramp 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Keehi Lagoon Park

A section of the road within the park is closed and traffic is detoured to the adjacent parking lot(s) between 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
